

Ana de Alvear uses archetypes giving special focus on self-esteem and its development.

These archetypes are used in order to facilitate its identification or rejection in the viewer who is doomed to have to overcome their reluctance to get to the fundamental wisdom of their own identity.

The Spectator is involved in a dialogue, which transforms their physical and spiritual perception, challenging their archetypal feelings by separating the elements of reality to which they belong, changing its intrinsic meaning.

Through visual tales, the viewer is invited to find the limits of himself, having the opportunity to move from his usual environment or comfort zone.

The viewer is led to reflect on their own visual prototypes and their archetypes regarding "the child" or "the adult", thus being able to resolve this paradigm individually.

Using resources found in classic works or themes, she uses stuffed animals and other types of toys, which symbolically represent child abuse, because if we killed a stuffed animal what we would be killing would be innocence, play, childhood...

The plants and insects are also fake, paradoxically making everything appear dead, as if it had never lived, and, in so doing invites the viewer to rethink what they see, instead of settling for the first impression.

At the same time, the fascination in the aesthetic sense of simplicity, where microcosms and macrocosms interact within an interchangeable poetic, makes this metamorphosis possible, introducing the audience into a poetic space full of emotions.

Adjusting to each space specifically, her work is based mainly on multidisciplinary installations where new experimental materials and media play a fundamental role considering them part of the dialog.

Pictorial works such as "Once upon a time... and now what" in which the future of nature is questioned has been exhibited in Museums of Natural Sciences and Botanical Gardens where the public of any age could reflect on their responsibility with respect to future generations.

Specializing in large-format drawings, her 3 x 7-meter Galaxies have been exhibited on several occasions in various spaces such as the Alcobendas Art Center in Madrid, the Cuenca Cathedral or the San Diego Museum of Art in the US.


*Everything you see **could be a lie***


Despite seemingly traditional subject matter, the title of this exhibition invites the public to question the veracity of what they see and hear, a contemporary concern in an age of frequent misinformation. As one looks closely at her work, it becomes evident that there are layers of meanings and deceptions. What originally appear as photographs or even paintings are all achieved, in astonishing hyper-realistic detail, with the humble medium of colored pencil.

This repartee with the history of art is not new; René Magritte spoke of “the treachery of images” and artists have been using *trompe l’oeil* (fooling the eye) techniques in painting for years to dialogue with the reality of the image, a conversation made more acute with the advent of photography and extended further into the digital age. Yet with de Alvear’s drawings, there is no digital or mechanical process involved.

Beyond this, de Alvear uses stuffed animals, knockoff porcelain, and plastic flowers and insects as her subjects to probe ironically the values of contemporary society. The compositions are inspired by European still-life paintings dating back to the seventeenth century, wherein artists painted such highly prized items as tulips, crystal, and imported porcelain, alongside insects and symbols of decay as *memento mori* (reminders of death).

Initially appearing humorous and playful, the inclusion of toys in de Alvear’s works nevertheless also embodies darker meanings of lost childhood and trauma, while the ubiquitous presence of plastic, only visible upon close scrutiny, alludes to the current crisis of the environment and impending animal extinctions, such as the artificial bee attempting to pollinate plastic flowers. Humans’ position in the universe is laid before us as we are made more aware of our physicality and scale in the presence of two dramatic galaxy murals, each comprising fifty elaborately executed drawings.











(El callejón del Gato)

Inspired by Schrödinger's Cat paradox, Ana de Alvear's multiverses play with the quantum superposition of the existence or non-existence of those universes, resulting from the connection to a random subatomic event that may or may not occur.

These multiverses could be part of the theoretical discussion of the interpretations of quantum mechanics, particularly in situations involving those measurement problems, of quantum entanglement during the development of the thought experiment.

In the “many worlds” interpretation formulated by Hugh Everett in 1957, the measurement process implies a branching in the temporal evolution of the wave function. The possibility that Schrödinger's cat is both alive and dead at the same time occurs, but in different branches of the universe, both being real though incapable of interacting with each other due to quantum decoherence.

In the “many worlds” interpretation, collapse is not objective, hence, it would be expected that the cat has settled into a defined state long before the box is opened, meaning that “the cat observes itself”.

In this alley, where the cat is just a pet, Ana de Alvear's multiverses wink at the viewer who has to ask again whether the drawings are abstractions or absolute realism of a paradoxical reality that may or may not exist.



This is an ongoing project about solitude and abandonment that implies drawings, video and real 3d models.










MEMENTO MORI

Color pencil drawings on paper

'Memento Mori' is the title of Ana de Alvear's series of works in which she invites the viewer to rethink the genre of still lifes that, since the 16th century, when it was born at the hands of Flemish and Dutch painters, reaches our days. In this genre, animals, fruits, and flowers evoke the brevity of life. Ana de Alvear's work reminds us that we all die and shows that moment full of light in which we are still alive.

In the drawings one can see the approach to the creator's tradition, with references to still lifes like that of the salmon, lemon, and vessels by Luis Meléndez, which can be seen at El Prado, or to the hanged hares in the hunting paintings by Eduard Vuillard or Wallerant Vaillant. De Alvear uses stuffed animals, porcelain and terracotta insects, and fabric and plastic flowers with which she composes her scenes, seemingly charged with an innocence that hides a dark background, questioning the borders between the real and the fake, and also reflecting, in a way, the death of innocence










